Confirmation Class Creed: 2017

For centuries, Christians have used creeds to express beliefs, truths and core doctrines. The beliefs we declare in creeds give us a foundation on which to build faith and practice. The Confirmands have written a Class Creed, a corporate proclamation of their Christian faith and belief. It is the culmination of their growth and learning this year .

I believe in God. God is an entity of LOVE that knows no gender. God created the Earth and made us in the image of LOVE. God put Jesus on Earth. LOVE answers prayer and is with us from our birth to our death. God loves each of us dearly.

I believe in Jesus, who is God's Son. Jesus was born of Mary through the Holy Spirit. He was raised as a Jew. Jesus performed miracles, including healing people. He helped the needy. He died on the cross for our sins and rose from the dead. Jesus will come again. He is with us now and will be with us for eternity when he returns.

I believe in the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit came as a Flame on Pentecost and continues to shine light. The Spirit is a Comforter that gives us a sense of hope. The Holy Spirit works through us, so we can do miracles. The Holy Spirit watches over the Earth and us.

I believe God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit are the Trinity. They are together, and yet separate—a great mystery.

I believe in the Church, a group of people that work together to help others. Church does not need to be a building or to be big and fancy. It can be any group of people that come together to worship God and to work together. Church provides opportunities for worship in the form of singing, praise, prayer, and listening. Worship brings people together with God within a place of holiness and grace. We participate in the Church through the United Methodist call that started with John Wesley. All are welcomed to be part of the Church, and those who participate within the Church are equal.

I believe in the Sacraments of Communion and Baptism. Communion is a remembrance of the body and blood of Christ. The bread signifies the Body, and the juice signifies the Blood. Communion is open to all people. It gives people opportunities to talk with God and to pray. Communion makes us feel like we are disciples of Jesus. Baptism is a time of cleansing with water. The water is the Holy Spirit of God washing over you to wash away sin. For some of us, Baptism happens when we are young. I believe that when parents bring their children for Baptism before the Church that parents are accepting the responsibility of teaching their child about God and that the Congregation will help support the family. I believe the Congregation promises to watch out for children and will teach children about God and LOVE.

I believe in God's Creation. God created the Earth and us, because God loves us. God loves everything that is created. God worked tirelessly to create the entire world and then rested. Creation was a great work requiring a lot of effort. Creation started with the Garden of Eden and with Adam and Eve.

I believe we all sin, and sin can be seen in many different ways. We are human. God still loves us even though we sin. Jesus dies to save us from sin, so we can repent of our sin.

I believe in the Grace of God. God's LOVE is always with us. Grace gives us the opportunity to live happily and freely in the LOVE of God. We are loved before we even know God and know LOVE (Prevenient Grace). God's Grace is a door for us to walk through and to accept the LOVE (Justifying Grace). We choose to accept Grace and then act with Grace to show God's LOVE to others (Sanctifying Grace).

I believe that Death is not the end. Jesus was resurrected for the dead and rose to heaven. We, too, will be resurrected and will be accepted into God's Kingdom in Heaven. I believe in the Kingdom of God, not only in Heaven, but on Earth, as well. We, who have accepted God and the Grace of God, are called to spread the Word of Christ. We are filled with the compassion of God and are called to be the Helping Hands of God, to show others the Kingdom of God and the hope of LOVE. We are called to be Disciples to follow Jesus and to live according to God's will. This we show by helping others and sharing the Grace of LOVE of Jesus. We do not have to mention Jesus to show others that we are Disciples. We believe anyone can be a disciple, just as we are disciples.
