The Staff Parish Relations Committee has decided to make changes to help align expenses within our budget. The following staffing changes are effective January 1:

- eliminate the church custodian position
- change the Maintenance Supervisor position from full time to part time
- create a part time/hourly "Facilities Prep/Event Setup" position
