Help Wanted: Volunteer Church Night Monitors

MLUMC is in need of a few volunteers to stay overnight in the church to monitor the smoke/fire alarm system. That's because a few weeks ago the church suffered a lightening strike that disabled the fire alarm system. The system notified the Dormont Fire Department anytime the church had a smoke related alarm. As a temporary solution until the system is replaced, 16 smoke alarms have been placed around the church. However, the smoke alarms do not notify the fire department any time an alarm is triggered, and so the church is required to have someone in the property at night to check on the smoke alarms.


A makeshift bedroom for volunteers has been set up in room 105, the Network classroom. It is equipped with a mattress, reading chair, light, alarm clock and WIFI. A volunteer would need to sleep there overnight and walk around to monitor the smoke alarms once in the evening and once in the morning.
