

What is a Charge Conference?

According to the United Methodist Church, the charge conference is the basic governing body of each United Methodist local church, composed of all members of the church council. All members of the charge conference must be members of the local church. The charge conference must meet at least once per year. It directs the work of the church and gives general oversight to the church council, reviews and evaluates the mission and ministry of the church, sets salaries for the pastor and staff, elects the members of the church council, and recommends candidates for ordained ministry.

Today, October 27: The One-Year Mark The Massacre at Tree of Life Synagogue in Squirrel Hill

Western PA is honoring the lives lost and the people affected by the mass shooting that occurred one year ago today at the Tree of Life Synagogue in Squirrel Hill. Eleven people died and numerous were injured in the anti-Semitic attack. Members of three synagogue congregations were worshipping in the building at the time: Tree of Life – Or L'Simcha Congregation, Congregation Dor Hadash and New Light Congregation.



The Pittsburgh region and Jewish service organizations have asked that those who wish to honor the victims do so through service, study and community. Official commemorative events, most taking place today, are under the umbrella theme, "Remember. Repair. Together." Mt. Lebanon United Methodist Church invites its members and friends to participate in a commemorative community service event today at the South

Hills Jewish Community Center on Kane Boulevard. A blood donor drive is taking place there between 12 and 4 pm. Tonight at 5 pm, a public memorial service is being held at Soldiers and Sailors Memorial Hall in Oakland.
