A Discussion on Suicide Awareness and Prevention For Those Suffering from Depression

The last of the Community Events and Outreach Committee's 3 part series on "Suicide Awareness and Prevention" will be held tonight at 7pm in Asbury Center. Dr. Cleon Cornes, a long time MLUMC member, will discuss the risks that individuals suffering from depression face relative to suicide and how such can be addressed.

Dr. Cornes is a graduate of the University of Pittsburgh's School of Medicine. His achievements include serving for 2 years in the United States Army Medical Corps in Germany, being a full time faculty member at Pitt, and providing care and treatment for numerous patients suffering from schizophrenia or depression. Dr. Cornes and his wife Vera Jane have been married for 61 years and have 2 daughters and 2 grandchildren.

As has been the case for the prior programs in this series, beverages and light refreshments will be available both before and after the program.
