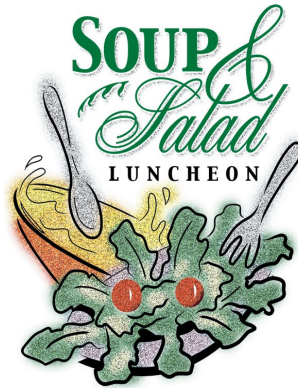
Next Week: Weekday Ministries Sunday at the 10:45 Service
