A Quiet Month

Lent is traditionally a time for reflection. Do we need to turn away from bad habits or bad influences and get on a new track (repent)?

Lent is a good time to ask the Lord if our parenting is all it should be. If we do it right, we honor and glorify God. If parenting is an afterthought, we may live to regret it.

Unfortunately, there are no guarantees. Children will eventually grow up to make their own decisions. We all know of super parents whose kids made bad decisions later in life. However, that is no excuse to be lazy about parenting.

During this Lenten month of March, spend some intentional quiet time nurturing your children.

- Read Bible stories at bedtime. Talk about what God is teaching through them.
- Pray with your children. Say what is on your heart.
- When you eat together as a family, talk about your gratitude for the things God has provided.
- Go for quiet walks together as spring starts to show signs of rebirth. Talk about God's creation. Talk about how God loves life.
- Go to church. Remind them that church is often quiet so people can meditate on God's Word.
- Have a family collection project. Collect coins, clothes or food for the needy.
- Be quiet in the car. No movies. No music. Talk to your children. Pray when you hear an ambulance. Share your day. Tell how God has helped you during the day.

An old saying says that *God allows U-Turns*. If your parenting needs one, Lent is a great place to change lanes. Don't worry. God will help you.
