We are in the midst of unprecedented times. As parents of young children, we know you are very concerned about their well being as well as your beloved child care center. The leadership of Mt. Lebanon United Methodist Church wants you to know that Weekday Ministries is a vital part of our ministry, and we want it to remain strong despite this difficult situation.

For that reason, Mettelise asked those families who are financially able to help us pay the staff for two weeks as well as pay a fee to keep the center functioning on a minimal basis while it is closed to children. It is with deep appreciation that we thank the families who were able to make this sacrificial financial payment. Our church was able to cover some of the costs, but we needed families to help us. With worship services cancelled indefinitely, you can imagine how steeply our offerings have declined.

By working together, we can be assured that our child care center will remain operable, and it will be ready to welcome your children with open arms when this health problem ends. Again, we thank you for your generosity, your continued financial support and your prayers.

Important Reminders

1. When the state says we can open, we will open immediately. A message through the Remind app will be sent.
2. Unfortunately, our teaching staff is currently unemployed. Anything they do is an act of love and service on their part, since they are not being compensated. Thank you! This is what makes our center so special...people like you.
3. Our state inspection will occur when we return. Keep up with your Child Health Reports if possible. No child under 2 can have a report on file that is more than six months old. For older kids, reports expire at 12 months.
