The Infant Room welcomes three new babies this month. We have Juliana, Dean and Scarlett joining our happy group.

Supertots are learning about snow, winter, safety and Martin Luther King. They are learning about animals that like the cold, Pittsburgh Penguins, and the theme *God keeps us safe*.

Tiny Tots are also learning that God keeps us safe. They are exploring how winter makes us feel, friends, family and homes.

Older Toddlers are exploring snowflakes, winter animals, Martin Luther King Day and friendship.

Jr. Pre-K is learning about the properties of water, frozen, ice, penguins, and Martin Luther King who taught us to care about everyone.
