The Opening Sentences

Introduction to the Service

The General Confession

Pastor: Therefore, I implore of all of you who are gathered here to join me, with a pure heart and humble voice, to approach the throne of grace as we say together:

People: Almighty and most merciful Father: we have done wrongly, and like lost sheep, we have gone astray from your Way. We have relied upon our own intuition, and have indulged in the desires of our own hearts. We have broken the laws you have revealed to us. We have done things we should not have done, and we have failed to do things we should have done; and we are powerless to save ourselves. Even so, O Lord, have mercy upon us sinners. Spare those who confess their faults, and restore those who are penitent, as you have promised to do through the Word of your only son, our Lord Jesus Christ. For the sake of the same Christ Jesus, grant that we may, from now on, lead Godly and righteous lives, that your name might be glorified. Amen.

The Absolution

Pastor: Almighty God, the father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who does not desire that sinners should die, but instead that they should turn from their wickedness and live; and who has given power to his ministers to declare to penitent hearts the forgiveness of their sins: God pardons and absolves the sins of all who are truly repentant and who truly believe the good news of the Gospel of Christ. Therefore, let us pray for true repentance of our sins, and the

abiding presence of the Holy Spirit, so that our current prayers and supplications may be pleasing to God, and that the remainder of our lives may be pure and holy, so that we may finally enter into the eternal joy of God's Kingdom; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

The angels will come out and separate the evil from the righteous ⁵⁰and throw them into the furnace of fire, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.

Individual and Family Communion Appointments 30-minute private appointments are available to receive the Sacrament of Holy Communion in a safe, hygienic, and physically-distanced manner. Each appointment will include a brief organ prelude, a prayer of thanksgiving, the receiving of bread and cup, and an organ postlude. If it has been a while since you have felt comfortable to come to the Lord's Table, now could be the perfect opportunity!

Holy Saturday, April 3

6:30 pm Outdoor Easter Vigil in upper parking lot.

The traditional Easter Vigil is by far the oldest of all services of worship in the Christian tradition, having been held since the earliest days of our faith. Since the beginning, the service has always begun outdoors, with the lighting of a fire from whose flames the Paschal or Christ Candle is lit.

Traditionally, the vigil would last through the night. We won't go that far! Our abbreviated vigil will be 45 minutes or less in length, rain or shine. In case of rain, the service will be moved indoors, so make your plans accordingly.

Easter Sunday, April 4

7 a.m. Outdoor Sunrise Service in the upper parking lot. As Easter morning moves from darkness into light, we will hope to sense the emotions of the women who first heard news of the resurrection. Our theme will be "Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!" This service will be 30 minutes or less in length, rain or shine. In case of rain, the service will be moved indoors, so make your plans accordingly. Please park in our lower lot, or in Laughlin's lot, and plan to join us.
