We are living in challenging times. The pandemic also has our country in its grip--some things just aren't possible. However, faith remains, community remains, and being there for each other remains. We celebrate services and try to stay in contact as much as possible. Some new work efforts have begun--we continue to learn new things. In our congregation there have also been various corona cases--we are thankful for the gift of the vaccination and believe that we as a congregation can overcome these big hurdles. One death of interest to MLUMC that was not related to corona was the death of Monika Dressel, who died on September 27, 2021, at the age of 79. Monika was known by all those who traveled to Zwickau since she usually hosted our work efforts in her created Garden of the Senses. Although she was totally blind, she always managed to get to know us.

The new video and audio systems make it possible for people to join our services from their computers, phones or devices. That includes people who cannot attend services in person because of sickness, immobility or location, as well as church seekers who are curious and want to see what MLUMC is all about. Your help is needed to ensure that we can offer our livestreamed service to these people every week.

# March 1st: Shrove Tuesday Celebration


Join us on the eve of Lent for an evening of fun and frivolity for all ages. A sausage and pancake supper will begin the night, followed by fun and games around the tables.
