Good Friday Fish Fry – The Tradition Continues



This year's Good Friday Fish Fry will be on Friday, April 15th, from 4pm to 7pm. As has been the case in prior years, there will be no charge for the meal, although donations will be accepted. Both eat-in and take out will be offered, as well as limited delivery to Food Pantry clients. Safety protocols will be in place to ensure that all are comfortable, notwithstanding the continuing presence of COVID 19.

As was the case in 2021, pre-packaged communion elements and a written message from Pastor Tom will be provided to those who wish to have them. Included with the message will be instructions as to how to take the elements. Pastors Tom and Scott will also be available to serve communion in person to anyone desiring such. Offering communion will again be a great enhancement to the overall Good Friday experience.

The menu, although streamlined due to cost and COVID concerns, will nonetheless be more than plentiful. Cod (baked or fried), French fries, Cole slaw, Macaroni and Cheese, Hush Puppies, a Sandwich roll, and a Cookie packet will accompany all meals. Those eating in will also have access to beverages, fruit, and desserts.

We are working on having a COVID 19 vaccination clinic available during the Fish Fry for any attendees (or volunteers) who wish to be vaccinated. More particulars will be provided in the coming weeks.

We plan to feed the masses on Good Friday and hope you will be among them. Thank you in advance for your support of this special Lenten event.
